PARKING INFORMATION



Paid parking is \$10 per hour
(with a 20 min free period).

Car parking is operated by Stellar.

Payment machines

\$10 per hour applies if entering the car park before 3:00pm.
\$5 per hour applies if entering the car park after 3:00pm.
Please pay at the marked pay machines using your vehicle number plate. Free parking available on Deepwater Basin road, please allow 25 minutes to walk to the visitor terminal from this location.



Parking for overnight cruise passengers

Find a park and proceed to the Visitor Terminal to check in, please use the designated pay machine **inside the terminal** to pay for overnight parking.
Parking for cruise passengers only - freedom camping is NOT permitted.



Mobility drop-off/parking

Mobility parking is available at the visitor terminal.
Parking charges still apply. Please pay inside the terminal.



Walkway from paid parking to visitor terminal:
Allow 10 minutes



Walkway from free parking to visitor terminal:
Allow 25 minutes

Piopiotahi is a World Heritage Area with high cultural significance. Its dramatic, remote environment can change quickly. Before you travel, plan ahead, know the hazards, and prepare accordingly.



KEEP NZ CLEAN

Camp with care and take away all waste. Use rubbish or recycling bins where available, or take your rubbish with you.

Pack a reusable bag and bottle — there are water bottle refill stations in Milford.



BE PREPARED

Dial 111 in an emergency.

Share your plans, make sure you have the right gear and take extra supplies in your vehicle if travelling independently.



PROTECT NATURE

Please do not feed kea or any wildlife, as it is harmful to them.

Leave dogs and pets at home as they pose a serious risk to precious wildlife. They are not permitted anywhere in the Fiordland National Park - even in your vehicle.



DRIVE CAREFULLY

The Milford Sound road is a scenic but remote and winding alpine route. Enjoy the journey by coach or guided tour if possible.

If self-driving, plan ahead, allow extra time for traffic and stops, and take breaks if you're tired. Keep left, drive carefully, allow traffic to pass when safe, and carry extra supplies, including snow chains in winter.

Mobile coverage is limited, and there are no petrol stations between Te Anau and Milford, so fuel up before you go.
